Discover the devastating events of 1666, and how a combination of decisions and circumstances led to the destruction of London.

### Famous Harrow People – Mrs Beeton

Find out who Mrs Beeton was, why she was so famous and how her story ties in with many dramatic changes in Victorian Harrow. Real artefacts, costumes and role play, bring this fun session to life.

### Owl's Amazing Adventures in Harrow!

Harrow on the Hill plus H14 plus five minute walk

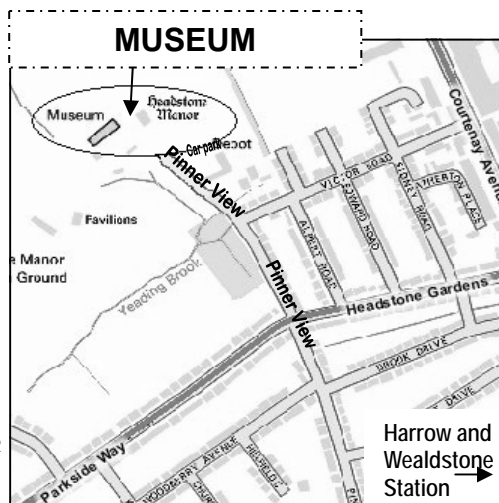
### By Bus:
